FINANCIAL

AFFORDABLE CONNECTIVITY PROGRAM

The Affordable Connectivity Program is an FCC benefit program that helps ensure that households can afford the broadband they need for work, school, healthcare and more.

The benefit provides a discount of up to \$30 per month toward internet service for eligible households. Eligible households can also receive a one-time discount of up to \$100 to purchase a laptop, desktop computer, or tablet from participating providers.

A household is eligible for the Affordable Connectivity Program if a member of the household receives Federal Public Housing Assistance, including the housing choice voucher program (Section 8). This means that all residents, whether you utilize the [Housing Choice Voucher \(HCV\)](#) or [Low-Income Public Housing \(LIPH\)](#) program, are eligible for this additional benefit.

There are two steps to enroll.

Go to AffordableConnectivity.gov to submit an application or print out a mail-in application. Once you are approved, contact your preferred participating provider to select a plan and have the discount applied to your bill.

Scholarships provide up to full tuition to 2- and 4-year public universities and colleges in Connecticut and up to \$2,500 to private, nonprofit 2- and 4-year universities and colleges in Connecticut.

Scholarship requirements are:

Complete 40 hours of community service
Miss no more than 72 days of high school

Non-Emergency Medical Chaperone Volunteer Program: Providing a Safe Way for Older Adults and People with Disabilities to Get to Medical Appointments.

Medical chaperone volunteers help older adults and people with disabilities get to their doctor or outpatient treatment appointments. Chaperones accompany clients traveling from their homes to their doctor's office using available local medical transportation providers. Chaperones offer physical support as well as emotional comfort to their clients, ensuring a safe and comfortable experience. Chaperones do not drive, instead their sole purpose is to help and attend to the client. Chaperones can be used to relieve a caregiver, assist individuals who may not know someone who can accompany them to their appointments, and/or serve as a responsible adult at time of discharge.

Volunteers receive a \$15 stipend each time they help accompany a client to and from a medical appointment.

Volunteers can serve as many clients as their schedule allows, but every effort is made to match volunteers who live within close proximity to their clients. On average, each accompanied trip takes 2-3 hours.

Volunteer Requirements and Responsibilities:

Requirements:

- Volunteers must be 18 years or older
- Need to complete a volunteer application form
- Need to meet with an Agency on Aging of South Central CT staff member and pass a background check
- Need to receive program training prior to service.

Volunteer responsibilities include:

- As a volunteer you will make friendly contact with your client to confirm his/her upcoming appointment.
- Meet the client at their home the day of the appointment before the transportation service arrives.
- Travel to and from the appointment with the client using a local transportation provider.
- Assist the client navigate the medical facility so that they reach their doctor's office.
- Ensure that the client is securely and comfortably back in their home after the appointment.

Service Areas:

This program primarily covers the towns of New Haven, East Haven, West Haven, Meriden, and Ansonia. We will accept, whenever possible, people from neighboring towns such as North Haven, Wallingford and Hamden.

Transportation Services:

The program works closely with the Interfaith Volunteer Caregivers Transportation Program (IVCG) who are able to help those individuals aged 60 or older who reside in the New Haven area. Chaperones can also accompany clients using other transportation services such as My-ride, the VA, Valley Transit, Mary Wade, Veyo, Uber, etc.

A healthy home is clean

A clean home reduces pests, dangerous chemicals, and asthma triggers.



The main idea

Some dirt—like pollen and soil—can get into your home from the outdoors. Other dirt—like dust, garbage, cigarette butts, and pest droppings—can come from inside your home. A dirty or cluttered home encourages pests and mold. Dirt may also contain dangerous chemicals, such as lead from old paint and other chemicals from many household products.

How it affects your health

- A dirty home
- May trigger asthma attacks and set off allergy symptoms
- May increase the risk for breathing problems, like asthma, coughing, and shortness of breath
- May increase exposure to dangerous chemicals—like lead and household cleaners—which cause poisoning and many other health problems

How to know if you have a problem

- Dirt or dust on floors, windows, furniture, counters, or curtains
- Grease or dirt on the stove or counters
- Old food or food wrappings lying around
- Garbage cans not covered
- Pests—like cockroaches or mice—or their droppings or urine
- Clutter on floors, furniture, or counters

How to fix the problem

- Clear away clutter: pick up things that do not belong on the floor, countertops, and furniture, and store them where they do belong
- Use safer cleaning and household products, and clean often
- Use a damp mop and damp dust cloth to clean
- Vacuum carefully and often: if possible, use a vacuum that has a HEPA filter, which picks up very small particles of dirt
- Wash bedding once a week, and use hot water to kill dust mites
- Leave your shoes at the door to keep dirt out of your home
- Put doormats at each door to trap dirt
- Keep pets off beds and out of the bedroom
- If possible, replace materials that are more difficult to clean (like carpets) with materials that are easier to clean (like wood or linoleum floors)

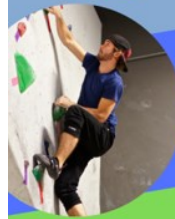

Non-Emergency Medical Chaperone Volunteer Program: Providing a Safe Way for Older Adults and People with Disabilities to Get to Medical Appointments.

Medical chaperone volunteers help older adults and people with disabilities get to their doctor or outpatient treatment appointments. Chaperones accompany clients traveling from their homes to their doctor's office using available local medical transportation providers. Chaperones offer physical support as well as emotional comfort to their clients, ensuring a safe and comfortable experience. Chaperones do not drive, instead their sole purpose is to help and attend to the client. Chaperones can be used to relieve a caregiver, assist individuals who may not know someone who can accompany them to their appointments, and/or serve as a responsible adult at time of discharge.

Volunteers receive a \$15 stipend each time they help accompany a client to and from a medical appointment.

Volunteers can serve as many clients as their schedule allows, but every effort is made to match volunteers who live within close proximity to their clients. On average, each accompanied trip takes 2-3 hours.

Volunteer Requirements and Responsibilities:

Requirements:

- Volunteers must be 18 years or older
- Need to complete a volunteer application form
- Need to meet with an Agency on Aging of South Central CT staff member and pass a background check
- Need to receive program training prior to service.

Volunteer responsibilities include:

- As a volunteer you will make friendly contact with your client to confirm his/her upcoming appointment.
- Meet the client at their home the day of the appointment before the transportation service arrives.
- Travel to and from the appointment with the client using a local transportation provider.
- Assist the client navigate the medical facility so that they reach their doctor's office.
- Ensure that the client is securely and comfortably back in their home after the appointment.

Service Areas:

This program primarily covers the towns of New Haven, East Haven, West Haven, Meriden, and Ansonia. We will accept, whenever possible, people from neighboring towns such as North Haven, Wallingford and Hamden.

Transportation Services:

The program works closely with the Interfaith Volunteer Caregivers Transportation Program (IVCG) who are able to help those individuals aged 60 or older who reside in the New Haven area. Chaperones can also accompany clients using other transportation services such as My-ride, the VA, Valley Transit, Mary Wade, Veyo, Uber, etc.

A healthy home is clean

A clean home reduces pests, dangerous chemicals, and asthma triggers.



The main idea

Some dirt—like pollen and soil—can get into your home from the outdoors. Other dirt—like dust, garbage, cigarette butts, and pest droppings—can come from inside your home. A dirty or cluttered home encourages pests and mold. Dirt may also contain dangerous chemicals, such as lead from old paint and other chemicals from many household products.

How it affects your health

- A dirty home
- May trigger asthma attacks and set off allergy symptoms
- May increase the risk for breathing problems, like asthma, coughing, and shortness of breath
- May increase exposure to dangerous chemicals—like lead and household cleaners—which cause poisoning and many other health problems

How to know if you have a problem

- Dirt or dust on floors, windows, furniture, counters, or curtains
- Grease or dirt on the stove or counters
- Old food or food wrappings lying around
- Garbage cans not covered
- Pests—like cockroaches or mice—or their droppings or urine
- Clutter on floors, furniture, or counters

How to fix the problem

- Clear away clutter: pick up things that do not belong on the floor, countertops, and furniture, and store them where they do belong
- Use safer cleaning and household products, and clean often
- Use a damp mop and damp dust cloth to clean
- Vacuum carefully and often: if possible, use a vacuum that has a HEPA filter, which picks up very small particles of dirt
- Wash bedding once a week, and use hot water to kill dust mites
- Leave your shoes at the door to keep dirt out of your home
- Put doormats at each door to trap dirt
- Keep pets off beds and out of the bedroom
- If possible, replace materials that are more difficult to clean (like carpets) with materials that are easier to clean (like wood or linoleum floors)
