I. Administrative

Our team continues to work toward our strategic pillars:

- House more families (more quickly) in the highest quality housing in communities of their choice
- Support residents' ability to live their best life and achieve goals that move them toward greater housing and life choices
- Cost effective and cost-efficient delivery of services in ways that maximize impact in our community (jobs, contracting, economic development) and
- Spark policy change that creates growth in housing market especially for families in need of affordable housing

Happy Graduation Day! Today is our very special Board of Commissioners meeting where we annually gather to honor our students who are graduating in the Class of 2024. This special opportunity to celebrate our graduates is a highlight of the year and a time to learn more about their future plans. ECC/HANH is excited to play a role in supporting the dreams of our youth.

On May 28th, the team and I returned to Ruoppolo Manor, a 360 MGT site, for a continuation of the community meetings that we are holding to address the issues of nuisance and criminal behavior happening at the site. We were joined by members of New Haven Police Department and the security company under contract. Resident concerns were documented as we continue to work collaboratively to resolve the problems.

For the second year in a row, the ECC/HANH/360 MGT team participated in the Freddie Fixer parade having a great time in community and highlighting the work that we do moving families forward. Our theme centered on our 85th year in operation and our role in resident success including homeownership. Thank you to all team members who participate in these community-facing events.

This month I traveled to the US Housing and Community Development Conference and Expo in Dallas TX and the CLPHA Board Meeting in Portland OR. Both offered opportunities for continued networking, sharing of ideas, and highlights of what we are accomplishing here at ECC/HANH.

We wrapped up our partnership with Havenly's Career Bridges program through which we hosted two new immigrant professional women for a paid internship. Our two interns came with strong professional backgrounds in education and electrical engineering and were placed in our Community and Economic Development and Planning and Modernization Departments respectively. On June 4th I was pleased to attend the Employer Appreciation Dinner as the final event of this cohort.

On June 10th we were pleased to host a contingent of staff and Board members from the Newark Housing Authority who visited to learn more about our organizations. At the suggestion of HUD, we were recommended as a place to visit to see and learn about some "best practices". Thank you to Chair Kilpatrick and Commissioner Witherspoon who joined us for the day. Thanks to all team members who helped to make the visit and the bus tour such a success.

II. Finance

APRIL 2024 YTD Financials

III. Operations

A. Vacancy Rate

HANH's current occupancy rate for the month for May 96.81%. The agency goal is 96.00%. Attainment of this goal remains one of the primary objective for the Operations Department.

B. Rent Collection

Rent Collection – HANH's rent collection for the year to date ending the month of May 2024 is -66%. The agency goal is 95%. The team is diligently working to align with our agency goal. We work with residents by offering CED support and repayment plans, prior to taking legal action.

FSS Program Highlights:

- M.T. started the FSS Program in 2019 and currently has a personal savings of \$30,000 since enrolling. Her goal is to continue to build her savins so she can use the fund toward She still has the plan to apply such savings towards her homeownership goal. She was given the green light to purchase but has struggled to find the right home in the current market. Additionally, she has accumulated \$20,876 in escrow (as of 5/1/24).
- I.F. started in the FSS program in 2022 with no personal savings account and PT employment of \$11,258 annually while working as a school bus driver. In 2022, she received a raise and is now earning approximately 50k a year. She struggled to pay off personal debts in the first few months of 2023, her landlord had ordered her to move out of her former place since he was selling the house, so she had a lot of expenses and was unable to save. She makes every effort to participate in virtual CAHS & FSS webinars throughout her job schedule. She felt she was ready to start saving for her goal of becoming a homeowner and has managed to save 13k to date.

Graduate Highlights:

SV. and L.G. –From the start of CARES, Sarah and her husband always dreamed of buying a home. They worked very hard to secure full-time jobs. They started unemployed and with zero income but eventually graduated to full-time employment. Her husband became a maintenance supervisor for a property management company. They both raised their credit scores from the low 500s to over 700. They also managed to save over \$40,0000. The CARES program played a crucial role in their success by allowing them to save monthly with a lower rental due to the lock in initiative that the CARES program offers all participants in year 3. Both are extremely proud of achieving this goal. They purchased a beautiful home in Naugatuck, Connecticut, and closed on it on May 23, 2004. REEF \$6,942- Credit Score- 720- Savings \$47,000

ECC Believes Highlight

• Live Girl has completed the Spring session of its mentoring program at Mill River Crossing with 6 female youth graduating. With feedback from youth and families who participated CED is planning to host another group in the summer.

- Assisted 26 youth with securing summer employment slots through Youth at Work
- Partnered with Youth Entrepreneurs for a Summer Business Program for high school aged youth to take place at the University of New Haven this summer. Youth will participate in two weeks and present business plan on the final day of the program.

V. Planning and Modernization

HUD Emergency Safety and Security Grant:

ECC was awarded \$250,000 for Emergency Safety and Security 2023 to address security upgrades at Essex Townhouses, a family development with 35 apartments. We are replacing an antiquated camera system and repairing damaged access control gates. Work is completed and the anticipated closeout is July 2024.

HUD Housing Related Hazards 2020

ECC was awarded a \$3,999,993 Housing Related Hazards grant to address the following Hazards at Scattered Sites, Essex, Crawford Manor, Wolfe: Smoke and Carbon monoxide, Radon, Mold and Vermin (high-rise buildings). Current obligation of funds is at 61% and expenditure of funds at 50%. HUD Lead Grant 2020--ECC was awarded \$3,700,000 for lead abatement.

Group D: 21 houses in the Scattered Sites East portfolio contract awarded. Construction started in 9 houses. 7 houses completed. Obligated 100% of the \$3,700,000 and have expended 49% of the 2020 lead grant funding.

- o George Crawford Structural Evaluation: ECC conducted a structural evaluation of 90 Park Street, which is on the National Register of Historic Places to provide information on the condition of the structure of the building for current life safety and information valuable to any future plans for the building. Determined that no structural work needs to be completed prior to RAD conversion, if redevelopment occurs in five years' time.
- o Essex Fire Units and Miscellaneous Development-wide upgrades: Schematic design phase: Scope of work is replacement of basement access doors and foundation repair to stop water infiltration/mold, renovation of 2 fire-damaged units, including the siding on 4 apartments, and necessary repairs to front stoops for code compliance, and to carports for removal of asbestos and mold.

Westville Manor The Authority submitted a 9% LIHTC application in November 2016 to complete the offsite component on the Rockview Phase II site and was awarded. - Contract closing for Rockview Phase 2 occurred on June 20, 2019. The Authority issued an RFQ for a Master Planner for Westville Manor and selected a team composed of Ken Boroson Architects and Torti Gallas Planners. The planning team has begun scheduling the necessary steps to prepare for the first application for on-site redevelopment with a target of January 2022. This application will address the first phase of Westville Manor consisting of 50 total units and will include the 21 unit 3-story main building. It is anticipated that funding for the final Westville Manor on-site phase consisting of 59 units will be submitted under the 9% LIHTC CHFA round in 2022 or 2023. The master Planning Team held a series of meetings and charrettes in September 2018 and will completed a final recommendation to stakeholders in January 2019. The Authority submitted a RAD application for Westville Manor and was awarded. It was determined that a Planned Development District (PDD) was the best approach to the redevelopment of the site. A PDD application was submitted to the City of New Haven in January 2019 that will include the redevelopment of 109 units on site of which 80% will be RAD replacement units and 20% unrestricted. The Board of Alders approved the PDD in April 2019. Submitted a 9% LIHTC application for on-site Phase 1 on January 12, 2022. This application was not awarded. The application will be resubmitted under the CHFA 2024 9% LIHTC round (due January, 2025). Anticipated closing in 3rd quarter of 2025.

DISCUSSION: Marcum LLP completed the audit of the Consolidated Financial Statements for the Housing Authority of the City of New Haven (HANH), D/B/A Elm City Communities (ECC). The Consolidated Financial Statements for HANH include two Discretely Presented Component Units – The Glendower Group, Inc. (Glendower) and 360 Management Group, Co. (360).

The HANH audit was conducted in accordance with GAAP (Generally Accepted Accounting Principles) and the standards applicable to financial audits contained in Government Auditing Standards. Based on the audits, Marcum LLP has issued an Unmodified Opinion on the Consolidated Financial Statements for HANH and its component units.

There were no deficiencies in internal control and no audit finding regarding the Financial Statements for FY 2023.

Key comparative financial results are as follows:

Glendower reflects the consolidated financial statements for the accounts of Glendower, its wholly owned subsidiaries, and Glendower as the managing members of [13] affordable housing sites for FY 2023.

360 Management began its own financial reports in FY 2018; all revenues and expenses functionally related to the Corporation's management of affordable housing programs were reported separately under Glendower in FY 2018. Since then, 360 Management has its own independent audit beginning in FY 2019.

Accompanying this resolution is a draft copy of the Audit Report, which includes the Management Discussion & Analysis and Summary of Activities and the Financial Data Schedule (FDS), which is the structured financial results by business grouping required for submission to HUD.

As ECC/HANH continues to convert developments from public housing to project based Section 8 housing under the Rental Assistance Demonstration Program (RAD), the CFP formula is expected to decrease.

ECC/HANH's 2023 CFP allocation was \$3,033,147.

ECC/HANH is requesting Board of Commissioners authorization to accept the CFP 2024 funds and ratification of the any and all actions of the President-Executive Director to execute, submit to HUD any required forms and supporting documents for CFP 2024, including those annual plans and five-year plans submitted through HUD's EPIC portal, and authorization to revise and submit documents when necessary and expend the allocated funds.

In addition to the approval to continue acquiring properties in this community, our Plan outlines ongoing efforts to ensure increased access to quality housing that is affordable, opportunities for families to increase their self sufficiency and initiatives that improve our cost effectiveness/cost efficiency. We continue to root our efforts to creating communities of choice where everyone has opportunities in innovative strategies to develop, acquire and manage affordable housing resources in the city, region, state and beyond.

A special thank you to Chair Kilpatrick and Commissioner Witherspoon who joined us for the Ribbon Cutting at Valley Townhouses on June 28th. It was a beautiful afternoon to showcase this amazing new community. Commendations to the Glendower Team and all who support the execution of our vision. The financial report covers eight months (October 1 through May 31) of data. Total Revenues are \$117,758,324. Total Expenses are \$74,647,757 (including depreciation expense of \$1,261,123). The excess of revenue over expenses is reduced by \$(43,094,123) capitalized expenditures. Depreciation expense add-back is \$1,261,123. The HANH Net Surplus of \$1,277,567 was as follows:

Program Highlights -

D.J. joined FSS in November 2023. Within just 7 months, he has exemplified determination and able to accomplish goals, with and has a current balance escrow \$879. He started with a credit score of 619, as of June'24 it has increased to 697 with his participation of FEC. Additionally, this month, he has successfully completed and graduated from the National

External Diploma Program (NEDP) at the New Haven Adult Education with his high school diploma. He currently works on a part-time basis and is looking to grow within the company.

- **D.W.** began FSS on June 2023, with a salary of \$18,642 a year as a Clinical Tech working part-time (F/T) for Yale. She got a raise by the end of 2023, and she is currently making \$57,742 annually.
- **L.M.** enrolled in FSS Program on May 2022 with a credit score of 690. Her credit score rose to 750 in 2023 while working with the FEC. Her credit score is currently 800.
- T.W. enrolled in the FSS program in 2023 with a credit score of 630. Her credit score as of right now is 734. She has been managing her debt by making on-time monthly payments for her bills and avoiding unnecessary purchases.
- J.C. enrolled in the program in 2023 and had two accounts in collections and a credit score of 588. She has been working with FEC and also been working with the Credit Professionals agency. Her credit score has risen to 669.
- A.H. joined the FSS program in 2019. She reported in 2021 that she had three delinquent accounts on her credit report, a \$300 monthly auto loan, and her credit score was in the 600s. After paying off her auto loan in 2023, her credit score increased to 671. Today she doesn't have any debts shown on her credit report, except for a \$10,000 school loan, which she pays off each month on time and her current credit score is 732.

V.Planning and Modernization

HUD Emergency Safety and Security Grant:

ECC was awarded \$250,000 for Emergency Safety and Security 2023 to address security upgrades at Essex Townhouses, a family development with 35 apartments. We are replacing an antiquated camera system and repairing damaged access control gates. Work is near completion and the anticipated closeout is September 2024.

HUD Housing Related Hazards 2020

ECC was awarded a \$3,999,993 Housing Related Hazards grant to address the following Hazards at Scattered Sites, Essex, Crawford Manor, Wolfe: Smoke and Carbon monoxide, Radon, Mold and Vermin (high-rise buildings). Current obligation of funds is at 61% and expenditure of funds at 50%.

HUD Lead Grant 2020--ECC was awarded \$3,700,000 for lead abatement.

Group D: 21 houses in the Scattered Sites East portfolio contract awarded. Construction completed in 9 houses. Obligated 100% of the \$3,700,000 and have expended 51% of the 2020 lead grant funding.

P&M Projects

o **George Crawford Structural Evaluation:** ECC conducted a structural evaluation of 90 Park Street, which is on the National Register of Historic Places to provide information on the condition of the structure of the building for current life safety and information valuable to any future plans for the building. Determined that no structural work needs to be completed prior to RAD conversion, if redevelopment occurs in five years' time.

o Essex Fire Units and Miscellaneous Development-wide upgrades: Construction documents phase: Scope of work is replacement of basement access doors and foundation repair to stop water infiltration/mold, renovation of 2 fire-damaged units, including the siding on 4 apartments, and necessary repairs to front stoops for code compliance, and to carports for removal of asbestos and mold.

ADDENDUM TO MOU between ECC and Yale School of Management | Inclusive Economic Development Lab

Principal Investigator: Kate Cooney

Yale School of Management agrees to expand the scope of work of the MOU with Elm City Communities to include the following additional activities:

Surveying of the residents of the former Church Street South location, defined as those residents who were renting units in Church Street South when the relocation process occurred who are currently living within 100 miles of the Church Street South location.

The following steps will be taken to secure a minimum of 40 resident survey assessments:

- 1) A random sample of 40 residents from the most recent list of locally residing resident information will be selected (n=117).
- 2) The team will make intensive efforts to reach each of the 40 residents on this list, including:
 - Sending a mailer to 40 addresses (T shirt and letter with unique CODE assigned by research team, QR code linking to scheduler app to make an appointment for phone survey call back)
 - b. Follow up letter mailed to residence with address on record by ECC
 - c. Facebook | Voting Record | Match with other ECC records to get PHONE number and updated address for outreach
 - d. Call 3 times (in evening 4-6pm or weekend (Sunday 4-6 or anytime if bad weather)
 - e. Third direct mail follow up postcard
- 3) If all of the efforts under #2 have been taken and respondent has not replied, team will move on and add the next randomly selected name to the list for outreach. We will continue until we have gotten to the end of the 117 names on the current list of former Church Street South residents provided by ECC OR until we complete 40 surveys.
- 4) Each former resident who takes the survey will receive \$50 gift card.
- 5) Additionally, using a respondent incentive approach, a \$20 gift card incentive will be provided to any eligible respondent who can provide a phone number to another eligible former Church Street resident, on the condition that the referred resident is eligible and completes the survey.
- 6) In addition to the above steps, the team will accompany ECC to community events with flyers, to take phone numbers of any resident who is eligible for a follow up phone call to check eligibility and take the survey by phone. Where feasible, the option to conduct the survey onsite will be offered.

- 7) A QR code to find out more about the survey will be embedded in the CNI ECC website and go out on the ECC socials.
- 8) Other outreach will include: presentations with flyers at CMT meetings in neighborhoods where residents are concentrated, flyers at library and on lamp posts, Radio and Newsprint outreach will be utilized as is feasible.
- 9) Data will be analyzed using descriptive statistics and cross tabs. Where possible and where useful, the data survey items collected will be benchmarked to data collected from same neighborhoods from DataHaven's community well-being survey, currently in progress.

For the purpose of providing the funds needed to (i) make the Loan to the Borrower for the financing and refinancing of the costs of the Brewery Square Project (ii) fund one or more reserve funds established under the Loan Agreement, if necessary (as hereinafter defined) (iii) pay capitalized interest on the bonds, if

needed and (iv) to pay certain costs of issuance and credit enhancement fees, if any, with respect to the bonds issued hereunder (collectively, the "Project"), We request that the Board of Commissioners authorize the issuance of its multifamily housing revenue bonds or notes in one or more series (collectively the "Bonds") to lend the Bond proceeds to the Borrower.

WHEREAS, Section 8-52 of the Connecticut General Statutes provides that a housing authority may issue bonds, notes or other obligations (hereinafter referred to as "bonds") from time to time in its discretion for any of its corporate purposes; and

The Brewery Square Project is located in the Fair Haven neighborhood of New Haven, Connecticut., and the Borrower has agreed to secure the Loan with a mortgage, assignment of leases and rents and other security, as may be required by the purchaser of the bonds; and

WHEREAS, the principal of and interest on the bonds may be additionally secured by an irrevocable direct-pay letter of credit, guaranty, insurance, surety agreement, standby bond purchase agreement or other credit enhancement or liquidity facility ("Credit Facility") issued by a credit facility provider; and

WHEREAS, for the purpose of providing the funds needed to (i) make the Loan to the Borrower for the financing and refinancing of the costs of the Brewery Square Project (ii) fund one or more reserve funds established under the Loan Agreement, if necessary (as hereinafter defined) (iii) pay capitalized interest on the bonds, if needed and (iv) to pay certain costs of issuance and credit enhancement fees, if any, with respect to the bonds issued hereunder (collectively, the "Project"), HANH has determined to authorize the issuance of its multifamily housing revenue bonds or notes in one or more series (collectively the "Bonds"), and to lend the Bond proceeds to the Borrower.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE HANH AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. In order to provide for financing the cost of the Project, the issuance and sale of the Bonds in one of more series is hereby authorized in the aggregate principal amount not to exceed \$25,000,000 as hereinafter provided. The Bonds shall be payable solely from sources and secured by such security as provided for in one or more Trust Indentures (the "Trust Indenture") by and between the HANH and U.S. Bank Trust Company, National Association or such other trustee as is appointed by the HANH (the "Trustee") and the HANH hereby pledges such security for the payment of the Bonds. The Bonds (a) shall not constitute a debt or liability of the State of Connecticut (the "State"), or of any political subdivision thereof, the City of New Haven (the "City") or the United States of America (the "USA"); (b) shall not constitute a pledge of the full faith and credit of the State or of any political subdivision thereof, the City or the USA; and (c) shall not directly, indirectly or contingently obligate the State or any political subdivision thereof, the City or the USA to levy or to pledge any form of taxation whatever therefor or to make any appropriation for their payment.
- 2. For the purposes of making a loan or loans to the Borrower, to provide for the financing, refinancing or reimbursing of the costs of the Project, one or more Loan Agreements by and between the HANH and the Borrower (the "Loan Agreement) and one or more notes and other security instruments (collectively, the "Note"), in the form and with the terms and conditions as may be determined by the Executive Director or such other officer as may be appointed by the Executive Director (the "Executive Director" or each such other officer, an "Authorized Officer") to be necessary or desirable for the benefit of the HANH or the security or marketability of the Bonds and the execution and delivery of such document or documents shall be conclusive evidence of such determination, are hereby approved; and any Authorized Officer, in the name of the HANH, is hereby authorized to execute and deliver such documents and the approval of the Board of Commissioners shall conclusively be determined from any of their signatures thereon.
- 3. For the purpose of providing for the issuance of the Bonds and further setting forth the terms and provisions applicable to the Bonds, the Trust Indenture, in the form and with the terms and conditions as may be determined by any Authorized Officer to be necessary or desirable for the benefit of HANH or the security or marketability of the Bonds and the execution and delivery of such document or documents shall be conclusive evidence of such determination, is hereby approved; and any Authorized Officer, in the name of the HANH, is hereby authorized to execute and deliver the Trust Indenture and such other documents pertaining thereto, including but not limited to, any supplements thereto, in connection with the issuance of the Bonds, and the approval of the Board of Commissioners shall conclusively be determined from any of their signatures thereon.
- 4. For the purpose of providing for additional security for the Bonds, the Assignment of the Note (the "Assignment"), substantially in the form as may be determined by the Executive Director, is approved; and any Authorized Officer, in the name of the HANH, is hereby authorized to execute and deliver such other documents pertaining thereto, in connection with the issuance of the Bonds, and the approval of the Board of Commissioners shall conclusively be determined from any of their signatures thereon.
- 5. For the purpose of additionally securing the principal of and interest on the Bonds, any Authorized Officer is authorized to (a) negotiate with or cause the negotiation with Credit Facility Providers to obtain a commitment for a Credit Facility (the "Commitment") on such terms and conditions as shall be determined by such Authorized Officer to be in the best interest of HANH, (b) appoint a Credit Facility Provider to additionally secure the principal of and interest on the Bonds and (c) execute and deliver such Commitment and such other documents pertaining thereto and the

approval of the Board of Commissioners shall conclusively be determined from any Authorized Officer's signature thereon.

- 6. Should the Bonds be publicly offered, then for the purpose of providing for the public offering and sale of the Bonds and further setting forth information relating to the Bonds, one or more official statements or offering memoranda (the "Official Statement"), in the form as may be determined by the Authorized Officer to be necessary or desirable for the benefit of HANH or the marketability of the Bonds and the execution and delivery of the Official Statement shall be conclusive evidence of such determination, are hereby approved; and any Authorized Officer, in the name of the HANH, is hereby authorized to distribute the Official Statement and to deem the Official Statement final when appropriate and is further authorized to execute such Official Statement and any amendment or supplement thereto on and after the sale of the Bonds, and the approval of the Board of Commissioners shall conclusively be determined from any of their signatures thereon.
- 7. That for the purpose of providing for the sale or private placement of the Bonds, one or more Contracts of Purchase (the "Purchase Contract"), in the form and with the terms and conditions as may be determined by any Authorized Officer to be necessary or desirable for the benefit of the HANH or the marketability of the Bonds and the execution and delivery of such document shall be conclusive evidence of such determination, are hereby authorized and any Authorized Officer in the name of the HANH is hereby authorized to execute and deliver the Purchase Contract, and the approval of the Board of Commissioners shall conclusively be determined from any of their signatures thereon.
- 8. That any Authorized Officer is authorized, in the name of the HANH, to appoint or approve of any consultants or professionals required to issue and sell or privately place the Bonds and to make the loans to the Borrowers, including the Bond Counsel, and the Board of Commissioners hereby authorizes any Authorized Officer to execute and deliver any and all documents required thereby or in connection therewith.
- 9. That the power (i) to establish the final aggregate principal amount of the Bonds (at not greater than \$25,000,000) which Bonds may be sold or privately placed in one or more series, the principal amount of the Bonds maturing in each year, the final maturity date for the Bonds, the interest rates to be borne by the Bonds, the redemption provisions of the Bonds, and the date and place for the sale of the Bonds, (ii) to sell the Bonds at a negotiated sale or a direct private placement pursuant to the Purchase Contract to one or more underwriters or purchasers and (iii) to execute and deliver any and all documents required thereby or in connection therewith, is hereby delegated to any Authorized Officer of the HANH and action taken by any one of such officers shall be sufficient.
- 10. That any Authorized Officer (and if any such action shall heretofore have been taken by any one of such officers, such action is hereby ratified and confirmed), be and is hereby authorized and directed (i) to publish such notices, to hold such hearings, and to take such other actions as shall be necessary to enable the HANH's Bond Counsel to render its opinion as to the exclusion of the interest on the Bonds from gross income for federal income tax purposes (ii) to request and accept an allocation of private activity bond volume cap from the State and (iii) to make, execute and deliver all such additional and supplemental documents, including any tax certificates and agreements, tax forms, assignments and any investment agreements, and to do and perform such acts and to take such actions as may be necessary or required for the consummation of the transactions provided for and contemplated by the Trust Indenture, the Loan Agreement, the Purchase Contract and the financing or refinancing or reimbursing of a portion of the costs of the Project.

- 11. The Bonds shall state on their face that neither the full faith and credit nor the taxing power of the City, the State, or any agency, department, or political subdivision thereof, the USA or the HANH is pledged to the payment of the principal of or interest on the Bonds. The Bonds also shall state on their face that they have been issued by the HANH to aid in financing a housing project for persons of low and moderate income.
- 12. Any Authorized Officer is hereby authorized to execute and deliver the Bonds and such documents, agreements, certifications, contracts or instruments as may be necessary or desirable to make the Loan to the Borrower and to issue, secure, insure and deliver the Bonds, including but not limited to, bond purchase agreements, tax regulatory agreements, land use restriction agreements, supplemental indentures, continuing disclosure agreements and to make any other representations and agreements to assure that the Bonds, if issued on a tax exempt basis, are issued on a tax-exempt basis and in compliance with Rule 15(c)(2)(12) of the Securities and Exchange Commission and to perform and take such actions or to designate other officials or employees of the HANH to perform and take such actions and execute such documents, agreements, certifications, contracts or instruments in connection with the issuance, security and delivery of the Bonds or the making of the loans to the Borrower as are determined necessary or advisable and in the best interests of the HANH to carry out and comply with the intent of this Resolution, and to carry out, comply with and perform the duties of the HANH with respect to the Bonds, the documents authorized by this Resolution and that the execution by the Authorized Officer or other officials of such documents, agreements, certifications, contracts or instruments shall be conclusive evidence of such determination. Should any series of Bonds be issued on a taxable basis, it is hereby determined that it is in the public interest to do SO.
- 13. The HANH hereby expresses its official intent pursuant to Section 1.150-2 of the Federal Income Tax Regulations, Title 26 (the "Regulations"), to reimburse expenditures paid sixty days prior to and any time after the date of passage of this Resolution in connection with the development of the Project with the proceeds of the Bonds. The Bonds shall be issued to reimburse such expenditures not later than 18 months after the later of the date of the expenditure or the substantial completion of the Project, or such later date the Regulations may authorize. The HANH hereby certifies that the intention to reimburse as expressed herein is based upon its reasonable expectations as of this date. The Executive Director or her designee is hereby authorized to pay Project expenses, if any, in accordance herewith pending the issuance of the Bonds. This Section 13 is included herein solely for purposes of compliance with the Regulations and may not be used or relied on for any other purpose.
- 14. Nothing in this resolution shall obligate the HANH to issue the Bonds if the best interests of the HANH would not be served by the issuance of such Bonds. Any capitalized terms, not defined in this Resolution, shall have the definitions assigned to such terms in the Trust Indenture or the Loan Agreement.

WHEREAS, in lieu of the standard PHA Annual Plan and Five-Year Plan documents, ECC/HANH is required to develop and submit to HUD, MTW annual plans and reports that articulate ECC/HANH's key policies, objectives, strategies, impact and outcomes for administration of its federal housing programs, in accordance with the terms of ECC/HANH's MTW Agreement, and

WHEREAS, Section II (C) of the Authority's Moving to Work Agreement (the "Agreement") requires that ECC/HANH hold at least one public hearing per Annual MTW submission; and make the Annual MTW Plan available for public comment for at least thirty (30) days, and

WHEREAS, the MTW Annual Plan for FY2025 was made available for public review and comment from April 15, 2024 to Tuesday May 14, 2024; and

WHEREAS, a public hearing was held on Monday, May 13, 2024; and

WHEREAS, a comment review period occurred from May 15 to May 29, 2024, and one (1) written comment was received.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS hereby approves and authorizes the submission to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) the Moving to Work Annual Plan for FY2025 and to make each, any or all of the following certifications and agreements with HUD in connection with the submission of the Plan and implementation thereof:

- 1. ECC/HANH published a notice that a hearing would be held, that the MTW FY2025 Plan and all information relevant to the public hearing was available for public inspection for at least 30 days, that there were no less than 15 days between the public hearing and the approval of the Plan by the Board of Commissioners, and that ECC/HANH conducted a public hearing on May 13, 2024 to discuss the Plan and invited public comment.
- 2. ECC/HANH certifies that the Board of Commissioners has reviewed and approved the budget for the Capital Fund Program grants contained in the Capital Fund Program Annual Statement/Performance and Evaluation Report, form HUD-50075.1.
- 3. ECC/HANH will carry out the MTW Plan in conformity with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, the Fair Housing Act, section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, and title II of the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990.
- 4. The MTW FY2025 Plan is consistent with the applicable comprehensive housing affordability strategy (or any plan incorporating such strategy) for the jurisdiction in which ECC/HANH is located.

- 5. ECC/HANH contains a certification by the appropriate State or local officials that the MTW FY2025 Plan is consistent with the applicable Consolidated Plan, which includes a certification that requires the preparation of an Analysis of Impediments to Fair Housing Choice, for ECC/HANH's jurisdiction and a description of the manner in which the MTW Plan is consistent with the applicable Consolidated Plan.
- 6. ECC/HANH will affirmatively further fair housing by examining its programs or proposed programs, identify any impediments to fair housing choice within those programs, address those impediments in a reasonable fashion in view of the resources available and work with local jurisdictions to implement any of the jurisdiction's initiatives to affirmatively further fair housing that require ECC/HANH's involvement and maintain records reflecting these analyses and actions.
- 7. ECC/HANH will comply with the prohibitions against discrimination on the basis of age pursuant to the Age Discrimination Act of 1975.
- 8. ECC/HANH will comply with the Architectural Barriers Act of 1968 and 24 CFR Part 41, Policies and Procedures for the Enforcement of Standards and Requirements for Accessibility by the Physically Handicapped.
- 9. ECC/HANH will comply with the requirements of section 3 of the Housing and Urban Development Act of 1968, Employment Opportunities for Low-or Very-Low Income Persons, and with its implementing regulation 2 at 24 CFR Part 135.
- 10. ECC/HANH will comply with requirements with regard to a drug free workplace required by 24 CFR Part 24, Subpart F.
- 11. ECC/HANH will comply with requirements with regard to compliance with restrictions on lobbying required by 24 CFR Part 87, together with disclosure forms if required by this Part, and with restrictions on payments to influence Federal Transactions, in accordance with the Byrd Amendment and implementing regulations at 49 CFR Part 24.
- 12. ECC/HANH will comply with acquisition and relocation requirements of the Uniform Relocation Assistance and Real Property Acquisition Policies Act of 1970 and implementing regulations at 49 CFR Part 24 as applicable.
- 13. ECC/HANH will take appropriate affirmative action to award contracts to minority and women's business enterprises under 24 CFR 5.105(a).
- 14. ECC/HANH will provide HUD or the responsible entity any documentation needed to carry out its review under the National Environmental Policy Act and other related authorities in accordance with 24 CFR Part 58. Regardless of who acts as the responsible entity, ECC/HANH will maintain documentation that verifies compliance with environmental requirements pursuant to 24 Part 58 and 24 CFR Part 50 and will make this documentation available to HUD upon its request.
- 15. With respect to public housing ECC/HANH will comply with Davis-Bacon or HUD determined wage rate requirements under section 12 of the United States Housing Act of 1937 and the Contract Work Hours and Safety Standards Act.
- 16. ECC/HANH will keep records in accordance with 24 CFR 85.20 and facilitate an effective audit to determine compliance with program requirements.

- 17. ECC/HANH will comply with the Lead-Based Paint Poisoning Prevention Act And 24 CFR Part 35.
- 18. ECC/HANH will comply with the policies, guidelines, and requirements of OMB Circular No. A-87 (Cost Principles for State, Local and Indian Tribal Governments) and 24 CFR Part 85 (Administrative Requirements for Grants and Cooperative Agreements to State, Local and Federally Recognized Indian Tribal Governments).
- 19. ECC/HANH will undertake only activities and programs covered by the Plan in a manner consistent with its Plan and will utilize covered grant funds only for activities that are approvable under the Moving to Work Agreement and Statement of Authorizations and included in its Plan.
- 20. All attachments to the MTW Plan have been and will continue to be available at all times and all locations that the Plan is available for public inspection. All required supporting documents have been made available for public inspection along with the Plan and additional requirements at the primary business office of ECC/HANH and at all other times and locations identified by ECC/HANH in its Plan and will continue to be made available at least at the primary business office of ECC/HANH.

In 2001, the Elm City Communities/Housing Authority of the City of New Haven (ECC/HANH) was awarded Moving to Work (MTW) status as part of the federal MTW Demonstration Program Established by Congress established in 1996, the MTW Demonstration Program was a pilot project that provides greater flexibility for ECC to design and test innovative local approaches for housing assistance programs that accomplish 3 primary goals:

On March 10, 2024, the MTW Agreement was extended for an additional 10 years to 2038.

 - ECC/HANH combined the initiatives for Deconcentration and Increasing Lease Up Success rates. Both initiatives offer mobility counseling services and participant and landlord incentives to assist participants in leasing up a unit of choice. The incentives include security deposit, application fee and utility deposit assistance for participants and an incentive fee for the landlord based on the bedroom size.
- ➤ 1.7 TBV for Supportive Housing Designated use of housing choice voucher resources for the purpose of ending homelessness. ECC/HANH works in conjunction with City and Regional entities, Continuum of Care, shelters, transitional and permanent housing providers to prioritize and identify chronically homeless, homeless families and other homeless populations.

ECC/HANH proposes an update for participants who successfully graduate from the CARES program, who choose to stay on site and pay Flat Rent (LIPH) or market rate rent (PBV).

 afterschool programming, case management to youth residents and developed
 program and workshop curriculum to support young children and families.

ECC/HANH will partner with a Social Service Agency that will provide supportive services to individuals. Funding only will be issued to the Social Service Agency by ECC/HANH to support the housing operating needs. ECC/HANH is currently working with Youth Continuum to provide transitional housing and support for up to 20 individuals.

360 Management

➤ 3.11F - Creation of New Instrumentality - The creation of 360 Mgt that includes the management of the units converted to the RAD/PBV platform. 360 Management is providing property management services to 1386 units in 23 developments.

Planning and Development

- Crawford Manor Upgrade bathrooms, perform exterior masonry, conduct a survey for additional shower pan needs, and design and implement protective pans over critical basement equipment.
- ➤ Robert T Wolfe ECC/HANH was awarded a Choice Neighborhoods Planning Grant in FY23. In this planning process, Wolfe redevelopment is being incorporated into the larger Union Square comprehensive redevelopment through ECC's Glendower Group. MTW funds are allocated for building repairs that are needs prior to a RAD conversion.
- ➤ Essex Townhouses Replace damaged basement access hatches and foundations, repair carports and balcony caps at half walls. Repair 2-fire-damaged units, change site lighting pole heads to LED, replace playground surface and equipment; design replacement of electric power masts and distribution panels; investigate code upgrade for stoops and front doors; perform an engineering study/survey for site drainage; investigate feasibility of separate heating for individual units.
- ➤ Scattered Site West/East/Multifamily Possible kitchen and bathroom upgrades; interior doors, walls, ceilings, floors appliances; fences, sidewalks, lighting, building envelope and exterior repairs, code upgrades, site structure repairs and replacement related to life health and safety issues. Continued Lead abatement.

➤ Housing- related Hazard Abatement - Grant awarded to address carbon monoxide, radon, mold and associated asbestos abatement, and pest infestation. Pest inspections and radon mitigation project completed. Carbon monoxide-smoke detectors installation, mold and associated asbestos abatement will continue in FY25.

NEW INFORMATION

Veterans Affairs Supportive Housing (HUD-VASH)

In collaboration with the HUD-Veterans Affairs Supportive Housing (HUD-VASH) program, ECC/HANH provides Housing Choice Voucher (HCV) rental assistance for homeless Veterans and the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) provides case management and clinical services.

ECC/HANH currently has a VASH allocation of 100 vouchers.

In an effort to increase the voucher utilization and assist more veterans with housing and supportive services, ECC/HANH will utilize the process for establishing a Designated Service Provider (DSP) to act in the place of the VA for Veteran selection, referral, intake, case management and supportive services.

ECC/HANH will also be able to serve in the role as DSP.

ACTVITIES PLACED ON HOLD

- Initiative 1.12 Development of Replacement Public Housing Units with MTW Block Grant Funds
 - o ECC/HANH has moved towards converting and repositioning LIPH units through a RAD mixed finance model and has not used this initiative since 2013. ECC/HANH's need to implement this initiative has been limited due to the RAD portfolio award.

CLOSED OUT ACTVITIES

➤ Initiative 1.8F- Farnam Court Transformation Plan

o The goal of this initiative was to transform an obsolete and unsustainable housing complex to a vibrant mixed-income, mixed use development that would also maintain affordable housing opportunities for our residents by creating a new neighborhood that included the creation of a central park with a community building. <u>This initiative has been completed.</u>

November 1, 2020 for a total contract amount not to exceed \$3,222,332.00.

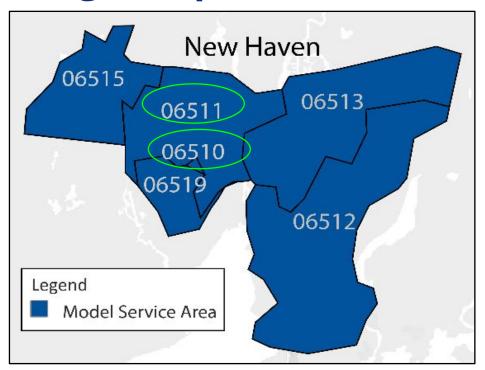

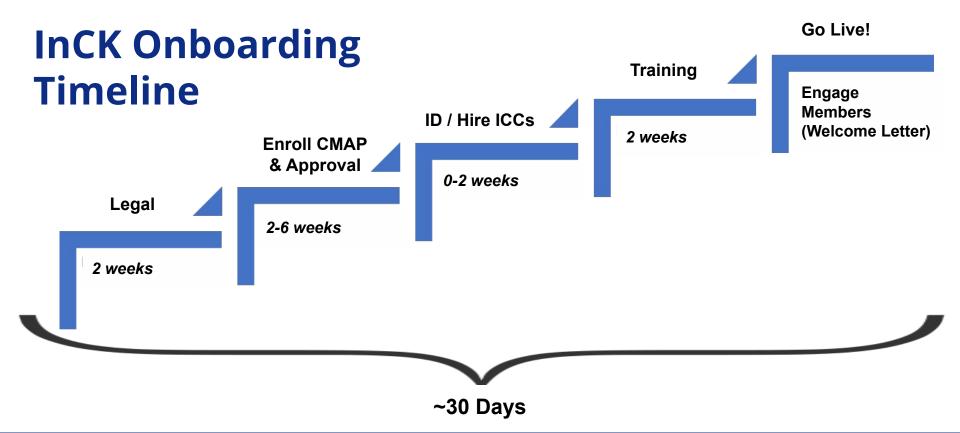

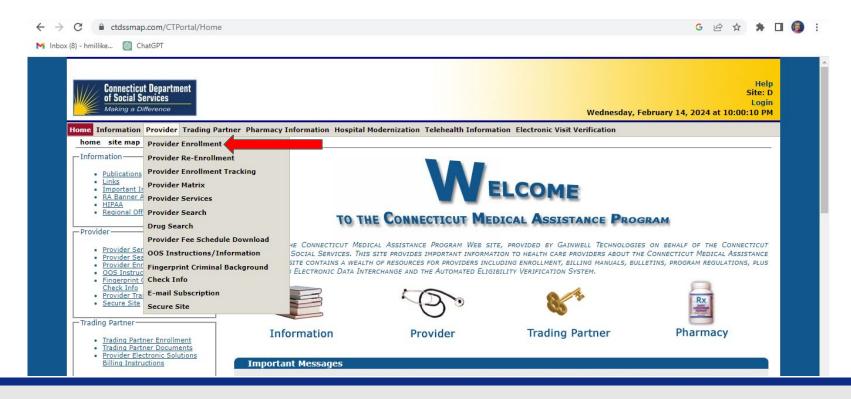

FAQs

- Are there InCK requirements on how many members can be assigned to each ICC?
 - No InCK has no limitations on this. ICC caseload should be determined by each provider based on their programmatic needs and business model structure.
- Can families receive other provider services within your organization if they are receiving ICC services via CT InCK?
 - Yes, a member can be referred to or obtain services from the same organization as long as the provider is not billing Medicaid for that other service. If the provider bills Medicaid for that other service, the ICC must also provide a list of referrals with the same provider as the last option.



FAQs

- Can families receive other care coordination services if they are receiving ICC services via CT InCK?
 - If the member is receiving care coordination services, the ICC needs to coordinate with the care coordinator to ensure no duplication of services are provided. Document compliance of non-duplication in member's record. E.g., ICC focuses on housing and educational advocacy, other care coordinator focuses exclusively on medical complex diagnosis.

Beers Guidance Clinic, Inc., with a principal place of business at 93 Edwards Street, New Haven, CT 06511 (the "Covered Entity").

RECITALS:

WHEREAS, the Business Associate creates, receives, maintains or transmits Protected Health Information ("PHI") on behalf of the Covered Entity, including but not limited to its billing functions;

WHEREAS, the Covered Entity and the Business Associate desire to comply with the requirements of the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996 ("<u>HIPAA</u>") as amended by the Health Information Technology for Economic and Clinical Health Act ("<u>HITECH</u>"), and implementing regulations which are codified at 45 C.F.R. Parts 160 and 164, as such regulations may be amended from time to time (collectively referred to herein as the "<u>HIPAA Standards</u>");

WHEREAS, the Covered Entity and the Business Associate acknowledge and agree that capitalized terms used, but not otherwise defined, herein are as defined in the HIPAA Standards; and

WHEREAS, the HIPAA Standards require that the Covered Entity obtain satisfactory assurances that the Business Associate will appropriately safeguard the PHI used or disclosed by the Business Associate in the course of performing services pursuant to the Agreement.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing and the mutual promises and covenants herein contained, the parties agree as follows:

1. Permitted Uses and Disclosures by Business Associate

- a) The Business Associate's use and disclosure of PHI shall comply in all respects with the HIPAA Standards and State law.
- b) Except as otherwise limited in this Business Associate Agreement, Business Associate may use or disclose PHI to perform functions, activities, or services for, or on behalf of, Covered Entity as specified in the Agreement, provided that such use or disclosure would not violate the HIPAA Standards if done by Covered Entity. Business Associate shall not use or disclose PHI other than as permitted or required by this Business Associate Agreement or as Required by Law. The Business Associate shall limit, to the extent practicable, the use and disclosure of PHI to the limited data set (as defined in 45 C.F.R. § 164.514(e)(2)) or the minimum necessary to accomplish the intended purpose of the use or disclosure

- of the PHI or as required pursuant to the Agreement. All such uses and disclosures by Business Associate shall be consistent with the Covered Entity's minimum necessary policies and procedures.
- c) Except as otherwise limited in this Business Associate Agreement, Business Associate may use and disclose PHI for the proper management and administration of Business Associate or to carry out the legal responsibilities of Business Associate, provided that (i) the disclosure is Required by Law, or (ii) Business Associate obtains reasonable assurances from the recipient that the PHI will remain confidential and used or further disclosed only as Required by Law or for the purposes for which it was disclosed to the recipient, and the recipient promptly notifies Business Associate of any instances of which it is aware in which the confidentiality of the PHI has been breached.

2. Obligations of Covered Entity

- a) Covered Entity shall provide Business Associate with the Notice of Privacy Practices that Covered Entity produces in accordance with 45 C.F.R. § 164.520, as well as any changes to such Notice of Privacy Practices and the Business Associate shall comply with such Notice of Privacy Practices.
- b) Covered Entity shall provide Business Associate with any changes in, or revocation of, permission by an Individual to use or disclose PHI, if such changes affect Business Associate's permitted or required uses and disclosures.
- c) Covered Entity shall notify Business Associate of any restriction to the use or disclosure of PHI that Covered Entity has agreed to in accordance with 45 C.F.R. § 164.522.
- d) Covered Entity shall not request Business Associate to use or disclose PHI in any manner that would not be permissible under the HIPAA Standards if done by Covered Entity.
- e) Covered Entity shall make all reasonable efforts to assist Business Associate with responding to an investigation or compliance audit by the Secretary, or an action by an attorney general having jurisdiction involving PHI subject to this Business Associate Agreement.

3. Obligations and Activities of Business Associate

a) Business Associate shall ensure, through a written agreement, that any subcontractors of Business Associate that create, receive, maintain or transmit PHI on behalf of the Business Associate agree to the same restrictions, conditions, and requirements that apply to the Business Associate with respect to such PHI, including without limitation, the restrictions, conditions and requirements of this Business Associate Agreement and the HIPAA Standards.

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- b) Business Associate shall report to Covered Entity any use or disclosure of PHI not provided for by this Business Associate Agreement, any Breach, any breach of security of personal information as defined by any applicable state law, or any successful Security Incident involving PHI of which the Business Associate, or a subcontractor of the Business Associate, becomes aware (each, an "Incident"). The Business Associate shall identify each individual whose PHI has been, or is reasonably believed to have been, accessed, acquired, or disclosed during an Incident. Notice shall be made to the Covered Entity no later than five (5) calendar days after discovery of the Incident by Business Associate, or a subcontractor of the Business Associate, whichever is earlier. Business Associate accepts the burden of demonstrating that such notice was timely, proper and in accordance with the HIPAA Standards. Business Associate shall, at its expense, take any action necessary or requested by the Covered Entity to mitigate, to the extent practicable, any harmful effect of an Incident. Business Associate shall, at its expense, provide all information and take all action requested by Covered Entity and consistent with the HIPAA Standards to assist Covered Entity in providing notice of an Incident.
 - (1) The foregoing notwithstanding, for purposes of the Security Incident reporting obligation under this paragraph 3(b), Business Associate hereby reports and Covered Entity acknowledges that (i) Business Associate experiences inconsequential incidents from time to time such as scans or "pings" that are not permitted past Business Associate's firewall ("Inconsequential Attempted Incidents"), and (ii) this report satisfies the requirements of the HIPAA Standards with respect to Inconsequential Security Incidents until such time as further guidance from the Secretary indicates otherwise.
 - (2) Notwithstanding anything herein to the contrary, in the event of an Incident caused by, or arising from, an act or omission of Business Associate or any subcontractor of Business Associate, Business Associate shall reimburse Covered Entity for: (i) its reasonable and direct costs related to such Incident, including but not limited to providing notification to affected individuals, establishing and operating a call center for affected individuals, investigating the Incident, and providing credit monitoring services to affected individuals; (ii) any fines or penalties levied on Covered Entity, resulting or arising from such Incident; and (iii) all reasonable attorneys' fees associated with such Incident. This Section shall survive termination of this Agreement. This Section does not, and shall not be interpreted to, limit or restrict any additional rights, actions or claims Covered Entity may have at law or in equity.
- c) Business Associate shall restrict disclosures or communicate confidentially with Individuals as required by the HIPAA Standards and as requested by the Covered Entity.

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- d) If the Business Associate maintains PHI in a Designated Record Set, the Business Associate shall:
 - (1) provide access (including inspection, obtaining a copy or both), in the time and manner designated by Covered Entity, and Business Associate shall not charge any fee greater than the lesser of the amount permitted by State law or the Business Associate's actual cost of postage, labor and supplies for complying with the request;
 - (2) make available PHI for amendment and incorporate any amendment(s) in the time and manner designated by Covered Entity; and
 - (3) provide access to PHI that is in electronic format in the form and format requested by the Individual or Covered Entity, or if not readily producible in such form and format, in a readable electronic form and format agreed to by the Covered Entity and the Individual, and transmit such copy directly to an entity or person designated by the Individual or Covered Entity. Business Associate shall not charge any fee greater than the lesser of the amount permitted by State law or the Business Associate's actual cost of postage, labor and supplies for complying with the request.

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- Business Associate shall make internal practices, books, and records relating to e) the use and disclosure of PHI available to the Covered Entity or the Secretary, in a time and manner designated by the Covered Entity or the Secretary, for purposes of the Secretary investigating or determining Covered Entity's or Business Associate's compliance with the HIPAA Standards. Business Associate shall document such disclosures of PHI and information related to such disclosures as would be required for Covered Entity or Business Associate under the HIPAA Standards to respond to a request by an Individual for an accounting of disclosures of PHI. Business Associate shall provide, in the time and manner designated by Covered Entity, an accounting of disclosures required by the HIPAA Standards made by the Business Associate. Business Associate shall prevent use or disclosure of the PHI other than as provided for in this Business Associate Agreement and shall comply, where applicable, with the HIPAA Standards with respect to electronic PHI and State law. The Business Associate shall implement and maintain safeguards as necessary to ensure that all PHI is used or disclosed only as authorized under the HIPAA Standards and this Business Associate Agreement. Without limiting the Business Associate's obligations under the HIPAA Standards, the Business Associate agrees to assess potential risks and vulnerabilities to PHI in its possession and develop, implement and maintain appropriate administrative, physical and technical safeguards set forth in the HIPAA Standards to protect the confidentiality, availability and integrity of the PHI that Business Associate creates, receives, maintains or transmits on behalf of the Covered Entity. These measures must be documented and kept current, and must include, at a minimum, those measures that fulfill the requirements outlined in the HIPAA Standards and all guidance issued by the Secretary.
- f) Business Associate recognizes that violation of any HIPAA Standard by Business Associate may subject Business Associate to civil and criminal penalties, including those set forth in 42 U.S.C. § 1320d-5 and 1320d-6.
- g) Business Associate shall not, and shall ensure that its subcontractors do not, directly or indirectly receive any remuneration in exchange for any PHI unless approved in advance in writing by the Covered Entity in accordance with the HIPAA Standards.
- h) Business Associate shall not, and shall ensure that its subcontractors do not, engage in any Marketing or fundraising that uses or discloses PHI.
- i) Business Associate shall respond to and shall assist the Covered Entity with responding to an investigation or compliance audit by the Secretary, or an action by an attorney general having jurisdiction involving PHI subject to this Business Associate Agreement.

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4. Term and Termination

- a) <u>Term</u>. The Term of this Business Associate Agreement shall be effective as of the Effective Date and shall terminate when all of the PHI maintained by Business Associate on behalf of Covered Entity is properly and completely destroyed or returned to Covered Entity, or, if it is infeasible to return or destroy the PHI, protections are extended to such PHI in accordance with the termination provisions in this section.
- b) <u>Termination for Cause</u>. Upon Covered Entity's knowledge of a material breach of this Business Associate Agreement by Business Associate, Covered Entity shall provide an opportunity for Business Associate to cure the breach or end the violation, and Covered Entity shall terminate the Agreement if Business Associate does not cure the breach or end the violation within the time specified by Covered Entity, or immediately terminate the Agreement if Business Associate has breached a material term of this Business Associate Agreement and cure is not possible, as determined by the Covered Entity in its reasonable discretion.

c) Effect of Termination.

- (1) Except as provided in subparagraph (2) of this subsection (c), upon termination of the Agreement or this Business Associate Agreement, for any reason, Business Associate shall return or, if authorized by Covered Entity, destroy all PHI maintained by Business Associate on behalf of Covered Entity. This provision shall apply to PHI that is in the possession of subcontractors of Business Associate. Business Associate shall retain no copies of the PHI.
- (2) In the event that Business Associate determines that returning or destroying the PHI is infeasible, Business Associate shall provide to Covered Entity notification of the conditions that make return or destruction infeasible. The Business Associate shall extend the protections of this Business Associate Agreement to such PHI and limit further uses and disclosures of such PHI to those purposes that make the return or destruction infeasible. Business Associate shall not use or disclose such PHI and shall maintain its security pursuant to this Business Associate Agreement for so long as Business Associate maintains such PHI.
- (3) The parties hereto understand and agree that the terms of this Business Associate Agreement are reasonable and necessary to protect the interests of the Covered Entity and the Business Associate. The parties further agree that the Covered Entity would suffer irreparable harm if the Business Associate breached this Business Associate Agreement. Thus, in addition to any other rights or remedies, all of which shall be deemed cumulative, the Covered Entity shall be entitled to obtain injunctive relief to enforce the terms of this Business Associate Agreement.

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5. Miscellaneous

- a) <u>Survival</u>. The respective rights and obligations of Business Associate under Section 4(c) of this Business Associate Agreement shall survive the termination of this Business Associate Agreement.
- Indemnification. Business Associate agrees to indemnify, defend, and hold harmless the Covered Entity and its officers, directors, employees, agents and contractors from any and all loss, liability, damage, cost, and expense, including without limitation civil monetary penalties, monetary settlements, fines, damages as a result of attorney general enforcement, and attorneys' fees resulting or arising from an Incident, breach of this Business Associate Agreement, violation of the HIPAA Standards, or violation of an applicable state data privacy or security law by Business Associate or its subcontractors, agents or employees, provided that Business Associate shall not indemnify Covered Entity for any act or omission made on advice, request or direction of Covered Entity. This section 5(b) shall survive termination of this Business Associate Agreement.

c) Relationship to Agreement.

- (1) The terms and conditions of this Business Associate Agreement will override and control over any conflicting term or condition of other agreements between the parties; provided, in the event that the Agreement contains provisions relating to the use or disclosure of PHI which are more restrictive than the provisions of this Business Associate Agreement, the more restrictive provisions will control. All non-conflicting terms and conditions of such agreements shall remain in full force and effect.
- (2) Business Associate's obligations under this Business Associate Agreement and any breach by Business Associate or a subcontractor of the obligations in this Business Associate Agreement shall not be subject to any limitations on damages that may be specified in any agreement, invoice, statement of work or similar document setting forth the services Business Associate is providing to Covered Entity including, without limitation, the Agreement.
- d) <u>Interpretation</u>. Any ambiguity in this Business Associate Agreement shall be resolved in favor of a meaning that permits Covered Entity to comply with the HIPAA Standards.
- e) No Private Cause of Action. This Business Associate Agreement is not intended to and does not create a private cause of action by any individual, other than the parties to this Business Associate Agreement, as a result of any claim arising out of the breach of this Business Associate Agreement, the HIPAA Standards or other state or federal law or regulation relating to privacy or security.
- f) <u>Amendment</u>. In the event that any law or regulation is enacted or promulgated regarding the protection of health information that is in any way inconsistent with

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the terms of this Business Associate Agreement or that interferes with Covered Entity's obligations with respect to the protection of health information so as to warrant a modification to this Business Associate Agreement or in the event any HIPAA Standard is amended or modified, the Covered Entity shall have the right to amend this Business Associate Agreement to effectuate such change by providing notice thereof to Business Associate but without having to obtain Business Associate's consent thereto. Except as set forth above in this Section 5(f), this Business Associate Agreement shall only be amended or modified upon written consent of the parties.

- g) <u>Application of State Law</u>. Where any applicable provision of State law relates to the privacy or security of health information and is not preempted by HIPAA, as determined by application of the HIPAA Standards, the parties shall comply with the applicable provisions of State law.
- h) <u>Severability</u>. If any provision of this Business Associate Agreement shall be declared invalid or illegal for any reason whatsoever, then notwithstanding such invalidity or illegality, the remaining terms and provisions of this Business Associate Agreement shall remain in full force and effect.
- i) Governing Law. This Business Associate Agreement shall be interpreted, construed, and governed according to the laws of the State of Connecticut. The parties agree that venue shall lie in Federal and State courts in Connecticut, without regard to its conflicts of law principles, regarding any and all disputes arising from this Business Associate Agreement.
- j) Notices. Any notice or other communication given pursuant to this Business
 Associate Agreement must be in writing and (a) delivered personally,
 (b) delivered by overnight express, or (c) sent by registered or certified mail,
 postage prepaid, to the addresses set forth above and shall be considered given
 upon delivery.
